3. COMPOSITION/INFORMATION ON INGREDIENTS

While the product is wet and being applied as per the directions on the package, the amount of airborne Respirable Crystalline Silica (RCS) will be minimal and over exposure via inhalation is not anticipated but it is still recommended that proper PPE is worn. Once dry any residues, grinding or strong abrasive forces etc may reintroduce RCS into the air so precautions should be taken.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye	Flush thoroughly with flowing water for at least 15 minutes and seek medical attention if
	symptoms persist. If wet cement is splashed into the eyes flush thoroughly with flowing
	water for 15 minutes and seek urgent medical attention.

Inhalation Remove from dusty area to fresh air. If symptoms persist, seek medical attention.

- **Skin** Remove heavily contaminated clothing immediately. Wash off skin thoroughly with water. A shower may be required. Seek medical attention for persistant irritation or burning of the skin
- **Ingestion** Rinse mouth and lips with water. Do not induce vomiting. Give water to drink to dilute stomach contents. If symptoms persist, seek medical attention.
- **Advice to Doctor** Treat symptomatically.
- **First Aid Facilities** Eye wash station.

Additional Information - Aggravated Medical Conditions

Inhalation Over exposure resulting from prolonged and repeated inhalation of dust containing crystalline silica can cause bronchitis, silicosis (scarring of the lung.) It may also increase the risk of scleroderma (a disease affecting the connective tissue of the skin, joints, blood vessels and internal organs) and lung cancer. Epidemiological studies have shown that smoking increases the risk of bronchitis, silicosis (scaring of the lung) and lung cancer in persons exposed to crystalline silica.

Skin Prolonged and repeated skin contact with cement in wet concrete, mortars and slurries may result in irritant dermatitis or alkaline burns.

Eye Irritating to the eye. If wet cement is splashed into the eye alkaline burns can cause permanent damage.

Procedures

Store off the floor in the original bags in a cool, dry, well ventilated area, removed from Storage excessive moisture and heat. Ensure packages are adequately labelled, protected from physical damage and sealed when not in use.

Handling Dry Mixed Concrete is supplied in 20 and 30 kg bags. Recognised local safe lifting methods should be used.

11. TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

Acute Toxicity No known toxicity data available for this product.

Eye Irritant upon contact with powder/dust. Over exposure may result in pain, redness, corneal burns, and ulceration with possible permanent damage.

- **Inhalation** Slightly corrosive. Irritating to the respiratory system, causing coughing and sneezing. Over exposure may result in severe mucous membrane irritation and bronchitis. Hexavalent chromium is reported to cause respiratory sensitisation, however due to the trace amount present, a hazard is not anticipated under normal conditions of use. Crystalline silica can cause silicosis (lung disease) with chronic over exposure, however due to low levels present and product application, adverse health effects are not anticipated.
- **Skin** Irritating to the skin. Prolonged and repeated contact with powder or wetted form may result in skin rash, dermatitis, and sensitisation.
- **Ingestion** Slightly corrosive. Ingestion may result in burns to the mouth and throat, with vomiting and abdominal pain. Due to product form, ingestion is not considered a likely exposure route.

Mutagenicity Insufficient data available for this product to classify as a mutagen.

Carcinogenicity Crystalline silica is classified as carcinogenic to humans (IARC Group 1). However, there is sufficient information to conclude that the relative risk of lung cancer is increased in persons with silicosis. Therefore, preventing the onset of silicosis will also reduce the cancer risk. Hexavalent chromium compounds are classified as carcinogenic to humans (IARC Group 1), however due to the trace amounts present, the criteria for classification is not met.

ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION 12.

- Toxicity Product forms an alkaline slurry when mixed with water. This product is non-toxic to aquatic life forms when present in cured solid form.
- **Persistence &** Product is persistent and would have a low degradability.

CEMENT CONTACT DERMATITIS: Individuals using wet cement, mortar, grout, or concrete Additional could be at risk of developing cement dermatitis. Symptoms of exposure include itchy, Information tender, swollen, hot, cracked, or blistering skin with the potential for sensitisation. The dermatitis is due to the presence of soluble (hexavalent) chromium.
